

Vulnerable Young Person Meeting:

Suggested structure:

- If the young person and or / parent(s) / carers are attending the meeting then the lead professional should ensure they are well briefed before the meeting.
- Lead professional should welcome everybody to the meeting and to explain briefly what the purpose of the meeting is and what they hope to achieve by meeting.
- Lead professional will begin a round of introductions & any make note of any apologies
- Lead Professional should sum up the incident(s)/cause for concern / risky behaviour leading up to the meeting being called.
- Relevant information to be shared by other practitioners including a reflection and analysis of relevant historical information
- The young person should be supported to offer their view of the concern(s) / situation.
- The parent / carer should be supported to offer their view of the situation.
- Whole group should identify any needs of the young person which should include: -
 - Health (physical / mental / sexual / emotional)
 - Education/training/employment
 - Accommodation
 - Recreation
 - Family/social network/support
- The whole group should complete analyses of risk based on all the information shared and thinking about any resilience / protective factors the young person may have.
- Formulation of a Vulnerable Young Person's SMART action plan to address: -
 - Accommodation
 - Transition to adult services
 - Training/education/employment
 - Emotional/mental health support
 - Other health needs e.g. substance misuse, sexual health
 - Support re ASB/offending behaviour
 - Family, social & community support
 - Recreation
